

"I help camp directors who are so overwhelmed they're afraid they'll miss something important. I give them tiny, camp-specific systems that take the pressure off fast, so they can lead with clarity again."

I think creatively, move ideas forward, and notice what makes each camp program unique. I enjoy solving problems and bringing my insights and systems from working with hundreds of camps across North America & Europe.

At BCCA, I will be delivering three keynotes that reconnect purpose with practical relief so directors head into summer feeling more in control (and less alone). The Power of ONE is the heart: how a five-second interaction from "one good adult" can become a turning point for a child's confidence and belonging. It gives leaders simple ways to train staff to notice kids, not just manage them.

For operational overwhelm, The Micro-City CEO treats camp like the complex "micro-city" it is and replaces constant firefighting with a lightweight operating system. Directors leave with the Protect-Amplify-Trim-Humanize filter and a few "works on your worst day" habits that reduce decision fatigue.



Finally, When Staying the Same Hurts More Than Changing helps leaders name the hidden cost of inaction and walk out with a 20-minute resilience sprint to eliminate one recurring pain point before next summer.

## FROM FRICTION TO FLOW: THE LEAN LEADERSHIP SHIFT

Canadian camps are strong on mission but often slowed by friction. This session introduces a practical, people-first approach to Lean thinking that helps camp leaders reduce chaos, reclaim time, and build strategic capacity during the off-season and peak summer. Through a hands-on activity and simple tools from the Resilient Blueprint Operating System, participants will see how small, repeatable improvements can create clarity, calm, and measurable gains across communication, staffing, and daily operations. Using the PATH framework and other "tiny tools," you'll learn how to make the right way the easy way and leave with one clear next step plus a free diagnostic to guide future improvements.

- Identify root causes behind busyness, burnout, and operational breakdowns
- Apply the PATH framework (Protect, Amplify, Trim, Humanize) to simplify decisions and align teams
- Design one low-risk, immediately actionable improvement to create flow and reduce friction

## HELP! MY STAFF HATES ME!

Okay, so not really. I mean who could hate YOU?!, but it certainly can feel that way sometimes. And, when it does, it can have an extremely negative impact on the productive, fulfilling working relationship and camp experience we want for all our staff members. Learn specific ways to recognize issues before they snowball into emergencies, the things we should definitely NOT be doing as leaders, and effective strategies and practical applications to earn (and keep) the respect of our staff members by effectively dealing with disrespectful staff and what to do with their feedback."



# HR & STAFF DEVELOPMENT

## SUPPORTING SUMMER STAFF IN THE STORM

Join Shonah for a practical, camp-focused mental health workshop designed to equip summer staff and leaders with the awareness, empathy, and tools needed to support their teams through the emotional highs and lows of a fast-paced camp season. Led by a former long-time camp staff member turned counsellor, this session explores how to recognize signs of stress, understand what's happening "in the gap" between minor problems and major reactions, and create safe, trusting environments without coddling or burnout.

Participants will learn skills rooted in applied psychology such as emotional validation, stress-response awareness, and CBT-informed tools to help build resilience in themselves and in those they lead. Perfect for anyone who wants to strengthen their leadership, support struggling staff, and cultivate healthier, more compassionate camp communities.

### PART 2

Whether you joined us for the first session or you're jumping in fresh, Part Two of this workshop offers practical, hands-on tools to help you confidently support staff through stress, conflict, and overwhelming moments at camp. We'll revisit the core concepts stress responses, "the gap," and CBT before diving deeper into how to identify actual needs beneath big emotions, offer meaningful validation, and guide staff toward healthier thinking patterns. Through real camp examples, blue-sky coaching techniques, and simple strategies for assessing distorted thoughts, you'll learn how to create safe spaces that foster growth without enabling. This session is ideal for anyone looking to strengthen their leadership, build trust with their team, and walk alongside staff with empathy, clarity, and resilience. New participants are welcome returning attendees will expand their toolbox even further.



## EFFECTIVE STAFF TRAINING / INSERVICES - THE SLASH BETWEEN A DIFFERENT WORD

This session will explore practical approaches to planning and delivering effective staff training and inservice experiences. 

Leader in sport and outdoor recreation, May Brown made significant contributions to the University of British Columbia and Canada over a career spanning more than 60 years. Brown taught physical education at the University of British Columbia from 1947 until 1955 and went on to earn her Master of Physical Education in 1961. As the coach of the women's field hockey team, she instilled a sense of team loyalty and accountability that continues to the present day. In her honour, UBC created the May Brown Trophy for the graduating female athlete of the year.

During her life, May was able to recognize and seize opportunities presented to her, and along with her inherited strength of character, she forged her own path for nine decades.

In 2000, Brown received a UBC Alumni Achievement Award and was inducted into the UBC Sports Hall of Fame in 2007 for her contributions to the sport of field hockey. She was recognized for her ability to motivate her players, earning their respect and admiration. Brown maintained a strong connection to UBC athletics, serving as a member of the UBC Sports Hall of Fame Selection Committee and UBC Athletics Council, and through ongoing support of the Big Block Club and women's field hockey team.

Brown also had a distinguished political career; she was motivated to join politics in part by the poor state of Vancouver's playing fields. She was elected to the Vancouver Park Board and served as city councillor for ten years. Her love of the outdoors and physical activity drew her to appointments on boards of directors of the YWCA, the Canadian Camping Association, the National Advisory Council of Fitness and Amateur Sport, and the Victoria Commonwealth Games Society.

During the 1960s and '70s, May and her husband Lorne established and operated Camp Deka Boys Camp in the Cariboo District of B.C., providing a wilderness camp program that influenced the lives of many boys and young men.

In 1986, she was appointed a Member of the Order of Canada. In 1993, Brown was inducted into the Order of British Columbia for her model community involvement: "Her contributions over the years, in teaching, physical education, sports and public service are a matter of record to British Columbia.
